2016-2017 - Inaugural Year

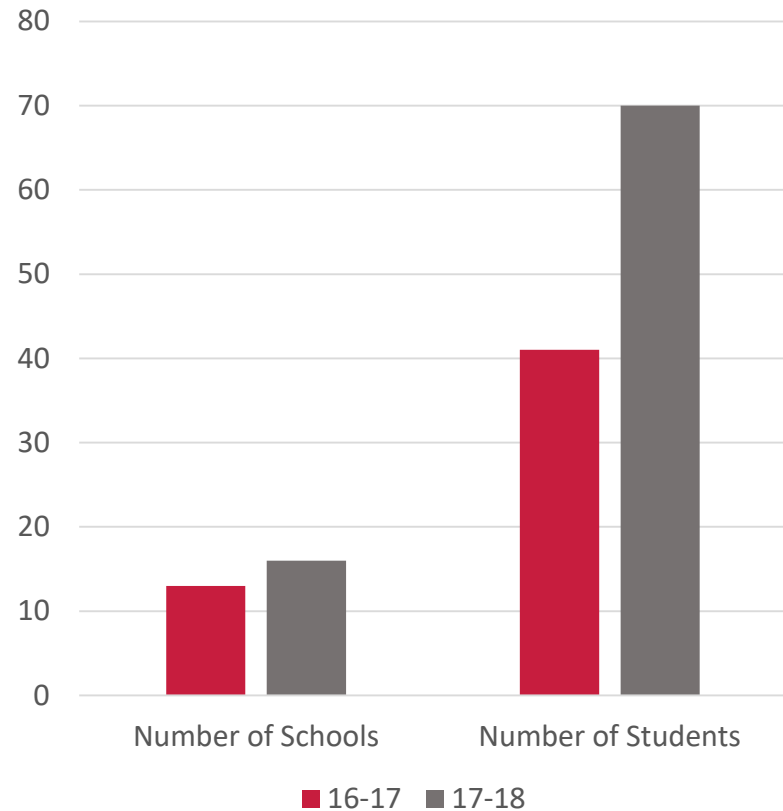
